March 19, 1947 – January 5, 2020

On January 5, 2020, the field lost a tireless advocate for children and educators, Dr. Rona A. Shaw. Rona was the Director of Graduate Programs in Education and the Teacher Education Program for Teachers of Students Who Are Blind or Visually Impaired at Dominican College for more than 35 years. She worked to promote university training and professional standards for vision education professionals in her graduate and undergraduate programs.

Rona was an author, researcher and scholar. She had written several books that have been published through the American Foundation for the Blind and she has presented numerous

articles and grants on topics including functional vision assessments, low vision utilization, preparation of Vision Rehabilitation Teachers and Orientation & Mobility Specialists, paraprofessional education, braille literacy and children with multiple disabilities. Rona was also the 2011 recipient of The Council for Exceptional Children, Division on Visual Impairments and Distinguished Service Award.

Rona had numerous affiliations with professional organizations and schools; both at the local and national level. Although too numerous to mention, she served at various levels as consultant, auditor, and member of the board of directors within many agencies, including AER.

Rona leaves a true legacy. She loved the field and developing new teachers. She was a mentor, teacher and advocate who approached every situation with a keen eye, kind heart and sheer grace. There were no limits to her vision. May we keep Rona's husband Rex and children Emily and Lauren in our hearts and prayers.

### What's Cookin' AER

With so many people following the keto diet, we thought it would be great to offer you a low carb option for this month's recipe. This meal, Mustardy Meatball and Cauliflower Gratin With Gruyere, serves four and will take approximately one hour to prepare.

Mustardy Meatball and Cauliflower Gratin with Gruyere

 head cauliflower (about 2 pounds), trimmed and broken into bite-size florets Kosher salt
pound ground beef, preferably 80/20
tablespoons Dijon mustard
Freshly ground black pepper
tablespoon everyday olive oil
cups heavy cream
cups grated Gruyère or aged white cheddar

1. Heat the oven to 450 degrees. Place four 2-cup gratin dishes on a foil-lined baking sheet.

2. Bring 1 cup water to a simmer in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the cauliflower, season with salt and cover the skillet. Cook until the cauliflower florets are just tender enough to be pierced with the tip of a knife, about 2 minutes. Uncover and continue cooking until the water evaporates and the cauliflower is fully tender, 4 to 5 minutes more. Divide the cauliflower among the prepared gratin dishes.

3. In a medium bowl, break apart the ground beef with your fingers into pieces about the size of a dime. Dollop the mustard over the beef, then season liberally with salt and pepper. Use your fingers to gently toss the beef until it's well-coated with the seasonings. Roll walnut-size pieces of beef into about 32 balls (1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-inch-diameter) and divide them among the gratin dishes, resting them on the cauliflower.

4. Pour ½ cup cream over the meatballs and cauliflower in each dish, season with salt and pepper, then top each with ¾ cup grated cheese. Bake until the meatballs are cooked through and the cheese is golden brown and bubbling on top, about 30 minutes. Serve while warm.
