A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This past week I was talking with a friend about my first six months as AER Executive Director, including a few operational changes that will be implemented in the upcoming year. She made a statement that resonated with me, "Change is a coming, but not everything is changing". She is correct. 2023 will bring change to AER, but some features and characteristics of AER will never change.

Let me share of few of the changes with you. This month, the Board of Directors will begin a new Strategic Planning process. I will keep you updated as the process continues. Our goal is to share the updated Strategic Plan by early summer. The AER Staff has been evaluating Association Management Software products to upgrade our current system. We will shortly begin accessibility testing of our two finalists, with the plan to begin implementation of our new system in the spring of 2023. Either program will allow for the integration of multiple software programs into one, saving money and improving operational efficiencies. The Membership Committee is continuing their work on evaluating the value of an AER membership and identifying ways to increase that value. Be on the lookout for announcements of Town Hall meetings and requests for assistance at the Chapter level as we roll out the new membership campaign.

There are features of AER that won't change, including member access to JVIB. With a cost savings of \$48,000 per year, I have changed how AER subscribes to JVIB. The details on how members will access JVIB are still being finalized with Sage Publishing. We will update the membership of any changes before the end of December 2022.

Finally, I want to wish all of you a happy holiday season and a prosperous new year!!!

Braille Institute of America Names James P. Kales as Chief Executive Officer

Please join the Braille Institute of America in welcoming James P. Kales, who has been appointed CEO of the Braille Institute, effective December 12:



Braille Institute announced today that the Organization's Board of Directors has named James P. Kales as Chief Executive Officer. He will assume day-to-day leadership of the organization as CEO on December 12, 2022. Kales, a leader in the non-profit sector, brings more than 25 years of experience working for organizations such as United Way and Big Brothers Big Sisters. For the past 15 years, he has served as Chief Executive Officer of <u>Aspire</u>, one of the Midwest's leading non-profits serving people with intellectual disabilities. Kales will be the seventh person to lead the 103-year-old organization.

Peter A. Mindnich, who has served as Braille Institute's President for the past 8 years will be retiring at the end of the year. "It has been an honor to serve as president of Braille Institute and I am incredibly proud of everything our team has accomplished together," said Mindnich. "I continue to believe Braille Institute's future is incredibly bright and I am confident Jim is the right person to build on the momentum we have created these past several years. Jim possesses the passion, strategic vision, and thought leadership to take Braille Institute into our next century of service."

"I am honored and humbled to be joining an organization with the legacy and impact of Braille Institute," said Kales. "I am beyond excited to be stepping into this role and look forward to working with the extraordinary team and Board of Braille Institute to expand our reach both in Southern California and the nation. The number of individuals who are blind or visually impaired will double in the U.S. to eight million by 2050, so the need to advance our mission has never been greater, and I'm confident we can rise to the challenge."

Kales graduated summa cum laude with honors from Bucknell University and received his Master's in Public Policy from the Harvard Kennedy School. He is fluent in four languages, including Spanish, French and Greek. He was born in Santa Monica and spent his early childhood in Los Angeles, while his parents worked as psychiatrists in the UCLA Health system.

Hunter College, City of University of New York, has been awarded a four-year grant from The Lavelle Fund for the Blind to focus on sustaining, revising, growing and evaluating our graduate programs in vision rehabilitation therapy. With this funding, we are able to form a team that will focus on the pressing question of where the field of VRT is heading. There is a critical shortage of ACVREP-certified workers nationally and our students are often hired prior to graduation, or sponsored by agencies to come to Hunter and complete their degrees. As the only VRT program in New York, and one of only a handful of programs nationally, it is important that we take on this work to ensure the sustainably of our programs.

Hunter College's Vision Rehabilitation Teaching (VRT) program was one of the first distance learning education programs in the field, starting in 2001. Hunter College has one of the oldest preparation programs for teachers of students with visual impairments (TVI), which was begun in the 1930s.
