AER Accreditation Program Needs Reviewers!

The heart of the AER Accreditation Program is the reviewers who serve on accreditation panels.

Over the next 12 – 18 months, thirteen organizations and seven university programs will be due for re-accreditation. Several other panels will be needed for first-time accreditation reviews. At a minimum, this means at least 40 review panel positions will need to be filled.

AER members are the front-line providers of services as well as leaders of organizations and university personnel preparation programs. That lived experience is key to AER's Accreditation Reviews. Being ACVREP certified is preferred but is not a requirement to be a reviewer; currently the roster of reviewers comprises certified professionals and licensed TVIs almost 100%. Additional skills in Blindness Prevention Services and all aspects of administration are also needed.

What all reviewers have in common is a desire to ensure that people who are blind or visually impaired receive the services they need to maintain a dignified independent life.

Besides these lofty ideals, recent reviewers enjoy the experience, saying "Thank you, I learned a lot" and "I will definitely do it again" and "Being on a panel really helped me get to know what it's all about."

Certification and Accreditation are the gold standards our field uses to lend confidence to consumers and assure excellence to funders and the public in general.

For agencies or schools serving the blind/visually impaired, and for university personnel preparation programs, AER Accreditation is that mark of excellence and commitment.

In recognition of this close relationship between certification and accreditation, ACVREP awards recertification points in Category 4 for serving on a panel that reviews the accreditation materials for an agency, school or university program. A total of 50 points can be earned in the 5-year term of certification, with 2 points provided for every hour served on the panel. Most panelists provide about 15 hours to a single review panel over a period of 4 months, and therefore earn 25 – 30 points on a single review panel experience.
